PARENT VOLUNTEERS - PRIMARY READING

The classes are looking for volunteers to help students read. This school reading program is designed to increase confidence in primary children through the teaching and guided practice of reading strategies. IS IT BULLYING?

It is important to distinguish between rude, mean and bullying behaviour so that teachers, school administrators, police, youth workers, parents and kids all know what to pay attention to and when to intervene.

Rude/Bad Behaviour = Inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone else.

Mean = Purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once (or maybe twice).

Make no mistake; mean behaviors can wound deeply and adults can make a huge difference in the lives of young people when they hold kids accountable for being mean. Yet, meanness is different from bullying in important ways that should be understood and differentiated when it comes to intervention by either parents or caring adults in a child's life.

Bullying = Intentionally aggressive behavior, repeated over time, that involves an imbalance of power.

Experts agree that bullying entails [three key elements](#): an intent to harm, a power imbalance and repeated acts or threats of aggressive behavior. Kids who bully say or do something intentionally hurtful to others and they keep doing it, with no sense of regret or remorse — even when targets of bullying show or express their hurt or tell the aggressors to stop. Bullying may be physical, verbal, relational or carried out via technology.

At Applewood we help students understand the difference between bullying and 'bad behaviour'. Students are encouraged to first use the DeBug strategies, then involve a grown up if they are unable to resolve a situation themselves. If as a parent your child tells you about a situation at school—as hard as it may be, your first, best step is to help give them the tools to try to deal with it themselves. If this doesn't work, speak to your child's teacher, but always try to help your child develop the tools work through adversity on their own first! This is an important life skill that we are trying to develop!
