You must register or update your child care needs each year. This must be completed no later than **March 13, 2020**.

HEAD LICE

Just a reminder about the proper protocol if you discover that your child has head lice. Please call the school to let us know so that we can send home a notice that alerts all parents in that classroom to check their child's head. All information is kept confidential. Treat your child for head lice, using an over the counter product from your local drug store and comb out the nits. Another option is the "wet combing" method which uses no chemicals but rather a fine comb. We have information sheets available at the office.

CANDYGRAMS

Students will have the opportunity to purchase Candy Grams and send them to a friend for Valentine's Day. Candy Grams will cost \$1.00 each. You can also purchase a Candy Gram for your child and send it to them on Valentine's Day. A paper order form will come home as we are not able to set this up on School CashOnline. Orders must be returned to the office by Tuesday, February 11th. Candy Grams will be delivered to students on February 13th. As with any fundraiser, participation is optional.

INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES

There may be times during the school year where inclement weather or other situations could cause transportation cancellations or school closures.

At times when student transportation has been cancelled and schools remain open, the decision of whether or not to have children in school on that day rests with the parent or guardian.

Should you decide not to send your child to school in the event that transportation is cancelled but schools remain open, or if your child is ill or late, please ensure that you report your child's absence on SafeArrival/School Messenger.

A key resource in any emergency is the DSBN Emergency Information form that you filled out at the beginning of the school year. Please let the school know of any changes in contact information or procedures you wish to be followed throughout the school year. HELPING YOUR KIDS AT HOME

LITERACY

Your child has access to award-winning digital resources through Kids A-Z, Learning A-Z's website created for students. After your child logs in, each website your child's teacher has subscribed to is shown. Your child can work on assignments or select other resources for reading and writing practice.

You can access resources on mobile devices by downloading the Kids A-Z app from the app store.

Kids A-Z Login Instructions:

- Step 1: Go to www.kidsa-z.com
- Step 2: Enter or choose the teacher's username
- Step 3: Your child finds his or her username on the class chart
- Step 4: Your child enters his or her password



How to Register for and Receive Progress Reports:

If you would like to receive activity and progress reports for your child and send him or her messages, you can register for parent access from your child's teacher. Once the teacher approves access, you can view reports and send your child messages by clicking on the parent link at the top of the screen at www.kidsa-z.com. Here are the three options for requesting access.

1. After your child logs in, click on the green parent button at the top right of the screen and enter your email address.
2. Send your email address(es) to your child's teacher at firstname.lastname@dsbn.org (go to www.applewood.dsbn.org for teacher email addresses).
3. Fill out the form that was sent home with your child and return it to his or her classroom teacher.

MATH

Applewood School has purchased **DreamBox Learning**, a K-8 digital math program that independent studies have found to raise student achievement and better prepare children for future success.

To Access DreamBox on a Browser:

Your student can access DreamBox Learning from any computer, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. All you need is a high-speed Internet connection.

To Access DreamBox on an iPad:

To download the DreamBox Learning Math app, go to <https://www.dreambox.com/ipad>, or search for "DreamBox Learning Math" in the App Store. If you already have the app installed, you'll want to make sure the latest version of the app has been installed so your student receives the most current experience and lessons.

When prompted in the app, enter this school code: **42cv/applewood**

Create your DreamBox Account to review your student's academic progress at home in your Family Dashboard. Please follow these steps to create your free account:

You will need your child's DreamBox school login information from their teacher to login for the first time.

1. Have your student login to their profile just as they would at school.
2. Click Setup Parent Access at the bottom of the page.
3. Follow the instructions provided to create a new login and password.
4. Read Terms of Use and Privacy Policy.
5. Click "Submit".

Log into your home account after setup:

1. Go to <https://play.dreambox.com>
2. Enter your email address and password.
3. To see student progress, click the "Family Dashboard" button.

REUSABLE CUTLERY & STRAWS



As part of our commitment to eliminating single-use plastics in the school, we will not be giving plastic straws to students who have ordered milk. Additionally, we will not have plastic forks and spoons available to students during snack / lunch breaks. Please ensure that your child comes with reusable cutlery and a stainless steel straw (available at dollar stores) if they require one for drinking. If you are really ambitious, try eliminating litter from your child's lunch by packing food in reusable containers—we can all do our part...every bit counts!

WATER BOTTLES

Hydrated students are happy students! Applewood has a water bottle filling station on each level. Students are encouraged to bring a re-useable water bottle to use at school. Please label the bottle with your child's name.



WARM, DRY & SAFE @ APPLEWOOD



A reminder that students must wear clothing appropriate for the cold weather. Students from grades 1-6 are outside twice a day for twenty minutes and Kindergarten students, even longer. Please ensure that your child is wearing a warm snowsuit, hat, gloves, scarf and winter boots. Indoor shoes are required for safety inside the school. Extra dry socks are also a good idea. Thank you!

ALLERGIES - PEANUTS & PUMPKINS



Please ensure that all food brought into the school is PEANUT, TREE NUT AND PUMPKIN FREE as we have students with life-threatening allergies in the building. Alternatives to peanuts and peanut butter are welcome in snacks / lunches. Please identify the type of alternative that is being sent in your child's agenda or lunch bag. If you have any questions, please contact the office.



REPORTING ABSENCES

Mrs. Flora, our Administrative Assistant, is in the office from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each week-day. **Please inform the office of all absences using the School Messenger App which can be downloaded in the App Store of your cell phone and online.** If you have any questions about the procedure, please feel free to contact the office for assistance. We do recognize that from time to time it is necessary to contact the school to get a message to your child. Please try to make all of the necessary arrangements with your child/ren in advance of school to avoid any missed communication. Students are able to use the office phone and are not to be using their cell phones during the school day, unless they ask permission to come down and use it at the office.



SCHOOL BELL TIMES & PUNCTUALITY

BEING ON TIME IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT FOR STUDENTS. Children who arrive at school at 8:30 am, when outdoor supervision begins, have the opportunity to socialize prior to coming into their classrooms, can attend Breakfast Club if they would like, and receive ALL of the quality instruction of the day without interrupting the class when they arrive. Additionally, the office is able to address attendance concerns without being interrupted. VISITORS & VOLUNTEERS

STUDENT MEDICATIONS

All medication that is to be administered to students at school must have an authorization form on file in the school. **These forms are available at the school office.** This includes allergy medication, inhalers and epipens. **If your child requires an epipen or an inhaler, please contact the office immediately so we can send home the proper paperwork and put emergency procedures in place.**
